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eyes of students in modern day Japan. Produced in partnership with Tradewind Arts and the Midwest Center for Holocaust Education, *Hana's Suitcase* will be directed by Walter Coppage and will be performed live on The Coterie's stage January 24-February 12, 2017.

ABOUT THE PLAY

In *Hana's Suitcase*, past and present mysteries come together in a captivating true story spanning 70 years and crisscrossing three continents. Fumiko Ishioka, a Japanese Holocaust educator, and her students set out to track down information about a suitcase from Auschwitz. It becomes a worldwide search for information about its owner, Hana Brady, whose fate they must piece together from her suitcase and artifacts. Hana's story reaches through time into the lives of the young Japanese students in a Holocaust story like no other - providing a contemporary global perspective and a fascinating history of love and tragedy from Hana's courageous life story.

The story of *Hana's Suitcase* initially gained public attention in 2002, when writer Karen Levine adapted Fumiko Ishioka's story into a popular non-fiction book for young adults. Published by Second Story Press, *Hana's Suitcase* won the National Jewish Book Award, the Bank Street College of Education Flora Stieglitz Straus Award for non-fiction, was a final award candidate for the Norma Fleck award, and has been translated into over 20 languages. The story inspired the 2009 documentary film, *Inside Hana's Suitcase*, and now has been adapted for the stage by Emil Sher. The Coterie and UMKC Theatre's co-production of *Hana's Suitcase* was announced as a National Endowment for the Arts award-winning project in December 2016.

Hana's Suitcase will run approximately 70 minutes with no intermission and will be best appreciated by families with ages eleven and older. The production is funded in part by the National Endowment for the Arts, Missouri Arts Council, ArtsKC Fund, Theater League, Jewish Community Foundation, Louis and Frances Swinken Supporting Foundation, Flo Harris Foundation.

ABOUT THE CO-PRODUCTION

Hana's Suitcase will be presented as a co-production between The Coterie and UMKC Theatre, a collaborative relationship that has become an annual tradition for The Coterie since it began in 1992, with *The Red Badge of Courage* and continued most recently with *And Justice for Some: The Freedom Trial of Anthony Burns [1858]* in 2016. Originally founded as a program that offered MFA actors the chance to work alongside established theatre professionals, the co-productions have since grown to feature both student actors as well as MFA designers and coaches from nearly every area of UMKC's Department of Theatre. The Coterie is proud to continue its long-standing relationship with UMKC Theatre, which benefits up-and-coming young professionals by providing practical, professional work experience, both on stage and behind the scenes.
