

<u>Kansas City, MO</u> – For two weeks only, The Coterie will present the return special engagement of *Electric Poe*, a unique theatrical event for families with ages 10 and older. *Electric Poe* features R.H. Wilhoit delivering three of Edgar Allan Poe's most loved works with live musical underscoring by guitarist Meredith McGrade. *Electric Poe* is a co-production with Union Cemetery Historical Society and is adapted by Wilhoit and directed by Coterie education director, Amanda Kibler. Just in time for Halloween, it will be performed outdoors at sunset in one of Kansas City's hidden gems, Union Cemetery, October 19-November 5, 2023.

SPECIAL ENGAGEMENT

By popular demand, The Coterie's *Electric Poe* returns to Union Cemetery to showcase three newly adapted Poe works.

Actor and Coterie teaching artist, R.H.

Wilhoit, captivates as the master of the macabre, performing Poe's beloved poems, "Annabel Lee," and his ode to obsession, "Berenice," as well as his claustrophobic classic, "The Cask of Amontillado," in which a man takes fatal revenge on his friend by entombing him within a stone wall. Music will once again punctuate the moody

masterpieces with reactive retorts from an electric guitar played live by composer and musician, Meredith McGrade, underscoring Wilhoit's dynamic delivery.

Wilhoit's previous turns as Poe have left audiences breathless, and critics spellbound. *BroadwayWorld* called his suspenseful storytelling, "haunting... Wilhoit, in the style of an 1850's orator, is magnificent bringing to life... masterpieces by the wizard of the macabre... an outstanding performance." *ThePitchKC* called *Electric Poe*, "creative... gripping... genuinely creepy... leering guitar chords are a major part of the chill." *KCStudio.org* noted, "*Electric Poe* brings an authentic chill to Union Cemetery... preserve[s] Poe's romantic voice while dialing in on the stories' most propulsive moments... engaging for adults but chaste enough for older kids."

Wilhoit will once again perform *Electric Poe* in front of Union Cemetery's "Holding Vault," built circa 1857, in order to bring the stories to life outside. Audiences have the opportunity to learn about the historical significance of Union Cemetery and the many important figures in Kansas City history that are buried there through a limited number of guided, pre-performance tours. Led by a member of the Union Cemetery Historical Society (UCHS), 60-minute walking tours are available on October 20, 27, and

November 3. A portion of each show and tour combination ticket will benefit UCHS and their efforts to preserve Kansas City's oldest public cemetery.

The Coterie's *Electric Poe* will run approximately 60 minutes and will be best appreciated by families with ages 10 and older.

THE ARTISTS

Electric Poe is directed by Coterie education director, Amanda Kibler, who previously directed PUFFS and Dear America for The Coterie's mainstage.

R.H. Wilhoit serves as adapter and actor and Meredith McGrade performs as the musician. The artistic and production company includes Mackenzie Goodwin (production stage manager), David Kiehl (sound designer), Jarrett Bertoncin

(lighting designer), Zan de Spelder (associate lighting designer), Georgianna Londré (costume designer), and Dorian Allen (production assistant).

The Coterie will begin *Electric Poe* on October 19 and run through November 5, 2023, in Union Cemetery, 227 East 28 Terrace, Kansas City, Missouri. Press Night will be held on Friday, October 20, at 7:00 p.m. The performance runs approximately 60 minutes with no intermission and will be best appreciated by families with ages 10 and older. Admission is \$25.00 for everyone regardless of age. Pre-show guided cemetery tours are an additional \$15.00 per person. The Coterie's community programming redefines traditional notions of work for young audiences with its unique dramatic writing programs (Young Playwrights' Roundtable), teen LGBTQ work (Project Pride), and mental health workshops in a dramatic format (Project Daylight), all free of charge.
